TONIGHT'S GAME

The Senators try for the series win against the Richmond Flying Squirrels in game two of the series Saturday night. The Senators won the series opener 9-6, highlighted by three Senators home runs. Richmond has lost five consecutive games after they were swept in three games on the prior series against New Hampshire. The Senators have not won a home series since they took two out of three from Bowie April 21 to April 23.

ROSTER UPDATE

The Senators made numerous changes to the roster over the past two days. First, starter Wirkin Estevez was added to the roster on Thursday. The right-hander earned the win in his first Senators start on Friday. Starting pitcher **Jaron Long** was promoted to triple-A Syracuse and **Kyle McGowin** was added to the Senators roster from Syracuse. McGowin is scheduled to start the series finale on Sunday. Finally, **Braulio Lara** was placed on the 7-day disabled list and Senators signed outfielder **Darian Sandford** from the Lancaster Barnstormers.

CORBAN CONNECTING

Since he started his Senators career 0 for 10, **Corban Joseph** is 13 for 32 (.406) with two doubles, a home run and nine RBI. The 29-year-old has recorded a hit in seven of his past nine games and multiple hits in four of the nine games.

COMEBACK KIDS

Wednesday's 12-7 comeback victory gave the Senators their second victory this season when trailing after six innings and biggest come from behind victory after they were down 6-0 at the end of two innings. The 12 runs were also the most scored by the Senators since they knocked off Erie 14-13 on May 22.

NEFTALI STAYS CONSISTENT

Neftali Soto has now reached safely on either a hit or a walk in 58 of the 62 games he's played this season and leads the team with 20 multi-hit games this season. Soto is fifth in the Eastern League in batting average at .320.

UNDER TWO HOURS

Tuesday's game between the Senators and RubberDucks lasted one hour and 58 minutes, the shortest nine-inning game of the season for the Senators. The game marks just the fourth nine inning Senators game since 2005 to finish in under two hours, and first since 2009 when the Senators beat the Trenton Thunder 1-0 in a one hour and 58 minute game.

SENATORS STARTING PITCHER

John Simms gets the call in game two of the series for the Senators. The right-hander is the lone remaining starting pitcher from the Senators opening day rotation. Simms is 2-4 with a 4.05 ERA across 12 starts this season. The 25-year-old has held the opposition to three runs or less in ten of his 12 starts this year.

RICHMOND STARTING PITCHER

The Squirrels counter with starter **Dan Slania**, who was just added to the roster on June 13. The right-hander made one start with Richmond to start the year before starting 12 games with triple-A Sacramento. Between the two levels, Slania is 1-8 with a 7.25 ERA over 13 starts. The 25-year-old is in his third season with Richmond after spending parts of both 2014 and 2016 with the club.
