TONIGHT'S GAME

The Senators welcome the Binghamton Rumble Ponies to FNB Field for the final series between the two clubs during the 2017 regular season. The Senators took two of three from Reading on the prior series despite losing the series finale 6-1 in a rain shortened four and a half inning game. The Rumble Ponies are 3.5 games ahead of Reading for the final playoff spot in the Eastern League Eastern Division, and have won seven of their previous nine games. The Senators are 5-6 against Binghamton this season.

LEADING OFF

Victor Robles homered on the first pitch of Thursday's series finale against Reading, giving the Senators their second lead-off home run of the season. Robles, the number one prospect in the Nationals organization and fifth best prospect in minor league baseball according to MLB.com, finished the Reading series 6-11 with a home run and four RBI and had his first three hit game as a Senators on Wednesday night.

POST ALL-STAR BREAK IMPROVEMENT

Since the All-Star break the Senators are 10-10 and six Senators are hitting over .290 in the 19 games after the break, including **Oswaldo Abreu** (.298), **Jose Marmolejos** (.299), **Corban Joseph** (.309), **Victor Robles** (.324), **Dan Gamache** (.352), and **Yadiel Hernandez** (.371).

RIDICULOUS ROBINSON

Andrew Robinson has not allowed an earned run over the previous eleven innings and opponents are just 5-39 against him over that stretch.

TUESDAY'S ACCOMPLISHMENTS

The Senators came back to win their fifth game of the year when trailing heading into the ninth inning in the series opener against Reading, the most such wins in the Eastern League this season. In addition, the Senators matched a season-high by tallying 18 hits and **Dan Gamache** became the eighth Senator this season to knock four or more hits in a game after finishing 4-4..

FEDDE PROMOTED TO THE NATIONALS

Pitcher **Erick Fedde** was promoted to the Washington Nationals on Saturday, and made his Major League debut when he started game one of the Nationals' double header against the Rockies Sunday afternoon. Fedde joins **Andrew Stevenson** and **Adrian Sanchez** as the three 2017 Senators to be called up to the big leagues. Fedde was optioned back to Syracuse on August 3.

SENATORS STARTING PITCHER

Greg Ross starts the series opener for the Senators. The right-hander 2-1 with a 6.95 ERA in four starts with the Senators. Ross began the season with the Senators before being promoted to triple-A Syracuse after two starts. The 27-year-old rejoined the Senators on July 20. Ross allowed a career high nine runs in his last start on July 29 in game one of a twin bill vs. Portland.

BINGHAMTON STARTING PITCHER

The Ponies send starter **Tommy Milone** to the mound in the series opener. Milone is on a Major League rehab assignment and is making his second appearance with the Ponies. The left-hander spent the entire 2010 season with the Senators, and went 12-5 with a 2.85 ERA, the second lowest mark in the Eastern League that season.
