TODAY'S GAME

The Senators and Binghamton Rumble Ponies meet for the final time during the 2017 regular season on Sunday afternoon. The Senators look to salvage a game in the three game series after dropping the first two games. The Rumble Ponies are 4.5 games ahead of Reading for the final playoff spot in the Eastern League Eastern Division, and have won nine of their previous 11 games. The Senators are 5-8 against Binghamton this season.

AIN'T IT GRAND

Drew Ward knocked in all four runs for the Senators in game two of the series with his sixth inning grand slam, the first of his career. Overall the home run was the Senators' third grand slam this season and first since **Jose Marmolejos'** go-ahead blast in the ninth inning against Erie on May 22.

SHORTENED GAMES

The Senators completed two games in a row that finished in six innings or less after their games on August 3rd and 4th were shortened due to rain. Prior to those two games, the Senators had not played an official game in six innings or less since July 7, 2013 at Bowie in game two of a doubleheader.

LEADING OFF

Victor Robles finished 2-4 Saturday night, his fourth multi-hit game in his past six contest. Robles, the number one prospect in the Nationals organization and fifth best prospect in minor league baseball according to MLB.com, is 10 for his last 21 with two home runs and four RBI and had his first three hit game as a Senators on Wednesday night.

POST ALL-STAR BREAK IMPROVEMENT

Six Senators are hitting over .280 in the 22 games after the break, including **Oswaldo Abreu** (.287), **Jose Marmolejos** (.286), **Corban Joseph** (.309), **Victor Robles** (.326), **Dan Gamache** (.333), and **Yadiel Hernandez** (.373).

RIDICULOUS ROBINSON

Andrew Robinson has not allowed an earned run over the previous eleven innings and opponents are just 5-39 against him over that stretch.

SENATORS STARTING PITCHER

Wirkin Estevez starts the series finale for the Senators. The right-hander is 3-1 with a 3.77 ERA across eight starts with the Senators this season. Estevez worked eight shutout innings in his last start against Binghamton on July 21, his longest start of his career. The 25-year-old has worked at least five innings in every start this season since his first start with Potomac on April 11th.

BINGHAMTON STARTING PITCHER

Binghamton counters with starter **Robert Gsellman**. The right-hander is making his third rehab start with the Rumble Ponies after he was placed on the disabled list by the Mets on June 28 with a strained hamstring. Gsellman is 5-5 with a 6.16 ERA with the Mets across 17 games and 14 starts this season.
