TONIGHT'S GAME

The Senators travel to Hartford, Connecticut for a four game series against the Yard Goats. The Senators are coming off their second consecutive road series win as they took two out of the three from Bowie while Hartford captured two out of three from Trenton on the prior series. This is the first meeting between the two clubs since they met at FNB Field May 4-7. The Senators are 6-4 against the Yard Goats this season.

HOME RUN HAPPY

The Senators hit eight home runs in the three game set against Bowie, including tying a season-high with three home runs in both game one and three of the series. At one point from the ninth inning on Tuesday night to the fourth inning on Thursday afternoon, the Senators last five hits were all home runs.

BOTH SIDES OF THE COIN

The Senators' 12-2 victory in the series opener against Bowie on Tuesday night was their largest margin of victory of the season. In contrast, the 14-2 loss they suffered in the next game on Wednesday was their largest losing margin of the year.

MICHAEL A. TAYLOR REHAB

Michael A. Taylor was added to the Senators roster prior to Tuesday's game on an MLB rehab assignment. The Nationals placed Taylor on the 10-day disabled list on July 7 with a right oblique strain. The 26-year-old joined Potomac on a rehab assignment on July 31 before joining the Senators. Taylor is 5-32 (.156) with a home run during the nine games on rehab and 2-13 with the Senators.

YADIEL STAYS HOT

In games played in the Eastern League since July 8, **Yadiel Hernandez** leads the league in batting average (.414) and on-base percentage (.475). Hernandez has raised his batting average from .242 to .290 over that period.

HEATING UP IN AUGUST

The Senators lead the Eastern League with a .308 team batting average during the month of August. Six Senators on the active roster are batting over .300 during the month: **Dan Gamache** (.423), **Yadiel Hernandez** (.419), **Jake Lowery** (.333), **Khayyan Norfolk** (.333), **Drew Ward** (.345) and **Oswaldo Abreu** (.367).

SENATORS STARTING PITCHER

Matthew Crownover starts the series opener in Hartford for the Senators. The left-hander is 1-5 with a 4.59 ERA in 12 starts with the Senators this season. Crownover has thrown a quality start in three of his past four starts, including tossing six innings of two run ball against Binghamton in his last start.
